6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Teaching and learning involve adequate advanced preparation for effective inflow and communication of knowledge in keeping with the syllabi in the calendar year.
- Application of modern need based teaching aids is ensured.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Examination and evaluation are the important part of academics. College follows all the examination related guidelines in letter and spirit and ensures their compliance through university approved assistant and senior superintendents.
- The faculty of the college is also engaged in evaluation work conducted at university headquarter.
- Besides the entire faculty also hold classes as well as departmental level group discussions and seminars in order to tap the full potential of students.
- College also conduct half yearly exam after the completion of 70% syllabus in order to provide students an opportunity to assess their performance and make further improvement.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Research and development are always at the core of academics as without their role and application, nothing can be found out therefore students are enlightened and encouraged to take part in seminars and workshops.
- Labrary & Laboratory facilities are also provided to the students to supplement the efforts of budding researches.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- NRC is always available for the faculty.
- Labrary & Laboratory infrastructure is updated time to time. ICT based instruments purchased are made available for the benefit of students.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

A Student being as a prime HR, the college strives to develop this resource through variety of activities like physical, social and cultural activities. Besides regular teaching the college provides a number of other support services which contribute significantly in the development of Human Resource.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Appointments for teaching and non teaching staff are done on the basis of merit and incompliance with the norms and rules as lay down by UGC, University and Government. The temporary staff is also recruited in teaching and non teaching category by the management. At present 90% teaching staff are held by permanent faculty. The process for the remaining posts is in progress.

Students of science and commerce are taken to nearby industrial units for an on the spot observation and learning the functioning of system. This helps the students to correlate their theoretical knowledge with its practical application.

- * Merit lists are generated based on the +2 marks and weightage for various categories GEN/OBC/SC/ST.
- * As the college is an aided institution, admission of students is done as per Government norms. 50% of the seats are filled as per the Government policy of reservation

- Different existing students friendly cells are proactive in leading the students to their destinations through ceaseless endeavours aimed at their betterment.

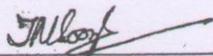
Challenges:
